- Providing Indigenous identity information that would result in a material advantage (e.g., gaining access to a restricted opportunity, additional funding, or reserved seats)

What do I need to do if I'm subject to the policy?

You must complete the following:

- Submit the Student Declaration of Indigenous Citizenship or Membership Form
- Upload the required documentation:
 - A signed form
 - Proof of Indigenous citizenship or membership from the community that claims you
 - Other requisite documentation (as outlined in the form)

Note: The affirmation process can take up to three weeks to complete.

Who reviews my information?

Your documents will be reviewed by the Indigenous Affirmation Advisory Committee (IAAC).

- You will be notified of the decision by the IAAC member.
- If your affirmation is not accepted, you will be given:
 - o A written rationale
 - o An opportunity to appeal and submit additional documentation


